St. Joseph's Secondary school is located in Nyakakindo Village Kikuube parish, Kiryandongo Sub County. It is a Mixed Day and Boarding 'O' level Secondary School, registered by the ministry of education and sports with no. PSS/S/276. It also has a UNEB center no. U1917.

The beginning

The School opened its gates to students in 2003. It was a brain child of a reputable accountancy consultant and businessman Joseph Kaaya. Talking with him some time back, he told me apart from the obvious investment reasons, the local leaders of the area had asked him to put a development project that would attract other developments in the village.

From the time it opened to date, St. Joseph's Tiiti is one of the best schools in the region in terms of infrastructure. It has permanent buildings; offices, classrooms and dormitories, laboratories, library, borehole, staff quarters within premises, play grounds, and a dining hall. It is one of the few schools that boasts of school gardens and guest rooms. Even its registration with the Ministry of Education and Sports was accelerated. This at the time was reserved for schools that had unique facilities and would invite the commissioner directly for inspection. No wonder in its first year of operation it registered the highest student population ever. I've talked to a number of former staff of St Joseph's Tiiti and they all admit, the period 2003 to 2006 was the best ever. Students and staff welfare, teaching and learning were at their best.

The reasons for the slow and progressive decline in the internal performance of the school are not very clear. Possibly the administrators of the time know better. What is not in dispute though,

is the fact that Mr, Kaaya, was not always around and most times took decisions based on reports of those on ground. This denied him the opportunity to appreciate the situation at hand before crucial decisions were taken. Besides, his often long absence meant, the managers on ground were not closely monitored and guided in their operations. This seemed to be the source of most problems that afflicted the young school.

Fed up with internal weaknesses, that the management at the time seemed reluctant to address Mr Kaaya in 2008 came into management contract with ECHO BRAVO, an NGO dealing in education consultancy and provision of education to disadvantaged children. It is during the tenure of ECHO BRAVO (2008-2010) that the school witnessed serious problems that led to its near collapse. These included but are not limited to; intermittent student's strikes, vandalism of school and neighbor's properties, internal financial irregularities, exit of capable teachers, irregularity of the managers themselves etc. With such occurrences the school's future was very uncertain.

Kigumba Intensive takes over St Joseph' Tiiti

Kigumba Intensive took over the management of St Joseph's Tiiti in 2011. This followed the signing of the lease agreement between the representatives of Kigumba Intensive SS and the proprietor, Mr. Joseph Kaaya.

Possibly the takeover would not have taken place, had I and Mr. Ogwal Tony, the Head teacher of Kigumba Intensive SS, not visited St. Joseph's Tiiti in 2008 looking for a UNEB centre where to register our excess S4 candidates. That time we got a school that was on a decline as explained above. Everything seemed to be in a mess. The compound had overgrown with a bush, many students were resting under trees during time

of class, vernacular was openly spoken among students and with teachers, only three teachers and the Headteacher were in the compound, etc. An air of indiscipline could easily be detected around the school by even a less curious observer. Our request was eventually not granted on acceptable circumstances, but I knew so well that management was not doing enough. When we returned, I shared this with my colleague, Maxwell.

With the numbers at Kigumba Intensive increasing and yet with a limited space, we had to think of ways of decongesting the Kigumba site. Matters were not helped by the fact that neighbors were not at the time interested in selling their land, which perhaps would have enabled us to expand. So the idea of approaching the proprietor of St Joseph's Tiiti crossed our mind.

Reaching out to Mr. Kaaya was not going to be an easy undertaking because he wasn't personally known to us, and besides only a few people in Kiryandongo actually knew him or had his contact. We tried many options but finally got a link through Ms. Halima Nsinda, (in Kigumba she is popularly known as Mama Namutebi) who through Asuman Kiggwe linked us to the LC 1 Chairperson of Nyakakindo Village. We approached the Chairperson and explained to him our desire to take over St. Josephs Tiiti, which idea he welcomed with re-

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lief. It seems he had been fed up with unending problems of the school that had even spilled over to affect members of his village. He promised to talk to Mr. Kaaya and give us feedback.

After three days he called to let us know that Joseph was positive about the idea and that he would be com-

ing over in a week's time. He did come. We presented our plan to him and he agreed. We both engaged our lawyers, agreements were drafted and signed on 5th/ January/ 2011. St Joseph's SS Tiiti officially became a subsidiary of Kigumba Intensive SS. That is how we got to take over Management of St, Josephs Tiiti.

It has been close to seven years since we took over the school and in that time the school has registered remarkable improvement in academic performance, students discipline and student and staff welfare as the Head teacher has explained. Both we and Mr. Kaaya are happy with the execution of the contract. Ideas are on the table and who knows, apart from time, what the future holds?

I wish to extend my appreciation to the following: Mr. Erisa Kiirya chairperson Nyakakindo Village, Mr. Kimanywa Stephen, Ms. Nsida Halima and Mr. Asuman Kiggwe for the role they played in linking us up and eventually meeting Mr. Kaaya. I'm very sure we would have taken longer or even failed to get to the proprietor had you not appeared at that opportune moment. I also thank Mr. Baguma George and Mr. Waiswa Patrick for the encouragement they gave us in the early stages of this undertaking.



COMMUNICATION FROM THE **MANAGING DIRECTOR** ASIIMWE GILBERT

Welcome to this KISMAG edition. This edition is special in as far as, for the first time, it incorporates detailed views from students and staff of St Joseph's Tiiti. I would like to extend my appreciation to Mr. Patrick Kilama and Ms. Judith Badaru, together with your teams, for the production of this joint publication. This edition's theme, 'it is your responsibility' is a

loud call to each one of us to effectively utilize the resources at our disposal, could be physical, mental or otherwise so as to achieve our desired ends. To this end the role of parents and teachers is to provide support to the student, usually in varying forms, BUT NOT to perform the particular tasks. The parent will produce you, take care of you right from childhood, pay your fees etc. The teacher will give you knowledge in the various areas of study, guide you on behavior and counsel you when you meet challenges etc. I have observed over the years, an in-

crease in the number of students not living up to their responsibility in spite of repeated guidance from teachers, and support from parents. I will illustrate this with a rather an unfortunate example. On 10th July 2017, The Headteacher of Kigumba Intensive SS indefinitely suspended four students who had been involved in drinking alcohol on a geography field work tour. As is the tradition in most serious Indiscipline cases, teachers escorted the suspended students to their homes. Around 8:15 Pm, I called the Headteacher to inquire whether Mr. Odaga Joseph who had accompanied a student to Nebbi District had returned. His answer was in the affirmative but he added (as told to him by Mr. Odaga) that the parent of the victim, after listening to the teachers explanation, was unhappy with the action taken by the school and went further to ask an incriminating question; where were the teachers when his son was taking alcohol? The frustration of the parent in such circumstances can be easily understood. The parent was satisfied he had fulfilled his responsibility, perhaps amidst all manner of difficulties and sacrifices, and so it was inconceivable that his child could be sent home. But can the commission of such acts be blamed on teachers, as the parents question seemed to imply? Granted part of the teacher's role involves guiding students on good behavior, and yes bringing to order those who deviate. However, to demand that teachers remain fixed watching over what each and every student does, is

to really demand so much. Unfortunately that is the expectation of many a modern parent. Teachers cannot be a solution to every of the child's problem. Teachers and schools, Teachers will not be available in the student's life forever! The parent's role stops at supporting the child to complete school. Who then will police or watch over the student in his house, trading center, in the market, social gatherings, community meetings, water wells, etc. long after he/she has left school? Part of the teacher's and indeed generally school's role, though inadvertently, is to prepare students to live independently in future. This demands that students are trained to perform certain tasks on their own in order to come face to face with the impending reality while teachers do the work of guidance. This may

be while in the school compound, in the class, in the dormitory, and indeed in field trips where students may be allowed to make independent discoveries. Some students however, use such times to engage in acts that break regular school norms. The result is being suspended in order to exclude the student from spreading the vice to the majority. A very unfortunate state of affairs but occasioned by the inability of the student to behave responsibly.

I have previously written in this magazine that the level of irresponsibility some students exhibit nowadays defeats words. There are several cases of irresponsible behavior; carelessness, laziness, raging desire for free things, failure to copy and revise notes, misuse of personal and school property, alcoholism, theft of colleagues and school property, casual sexual relationships, carefree attitudes, lack of empathy, dishonesty, shabbiness, misuse of school fees, hooliganism etc, to name but some of them. Whatever the reasons for the proliferation in these vices, they are, without doubt, a surest way of achieving an appallingly useless life.

Teachers and parents will try and guide and call those portraying arbitrary behavior to order but they will not do the particular tasks for you. For example they will not read books and answer exams for you, they will not tell you to brush your teeth or bathe, wash your stockings or comb you hair, when you are leaving independently in your house in future. In the end your personal life whether full of opportunities or misfortunes is your responsibility.

Have that extra ingredient that makes taking action more of a natural thing. You do not get stuck in just thinking, thinking and wishing so much you become proactive instead of passive.

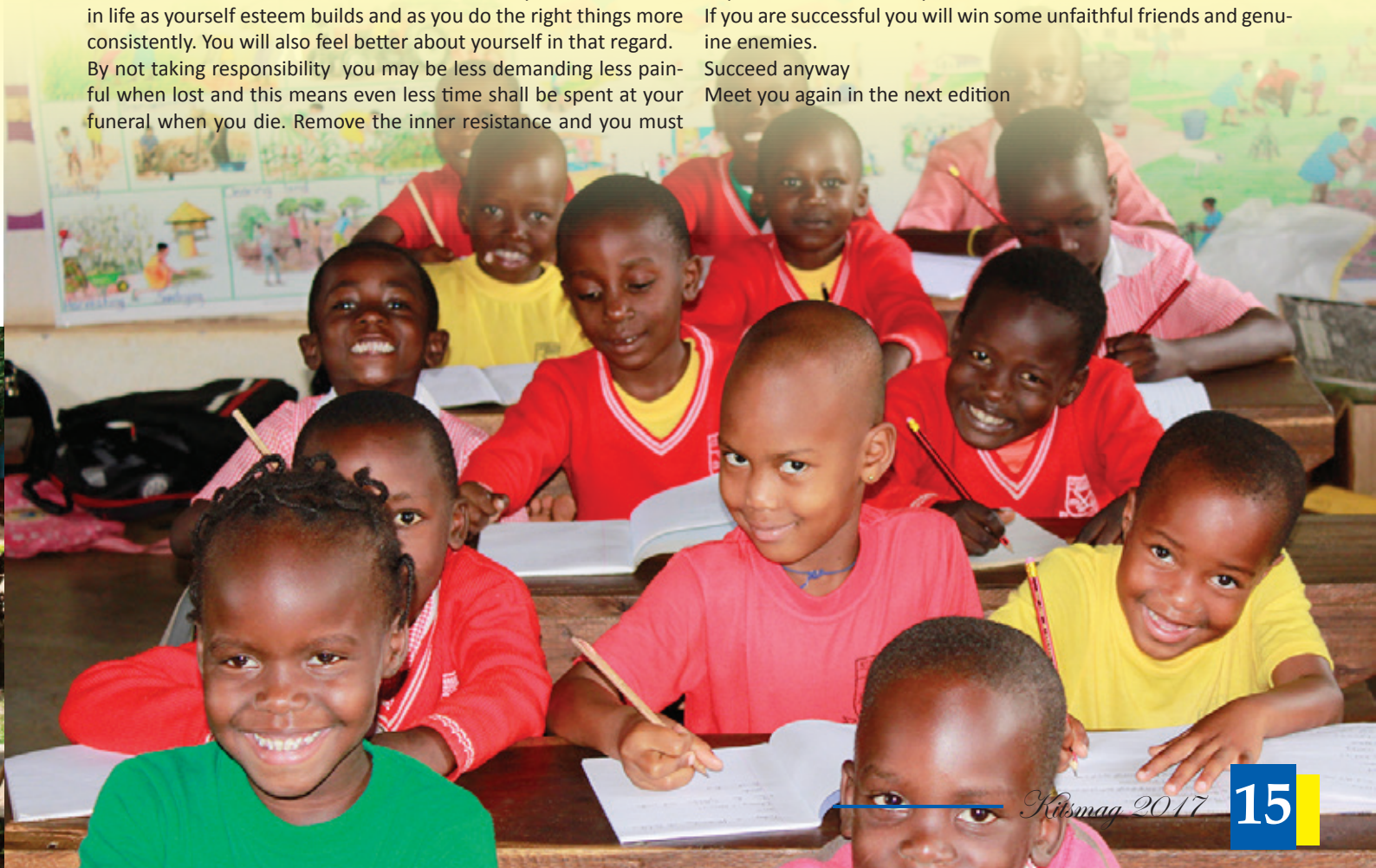

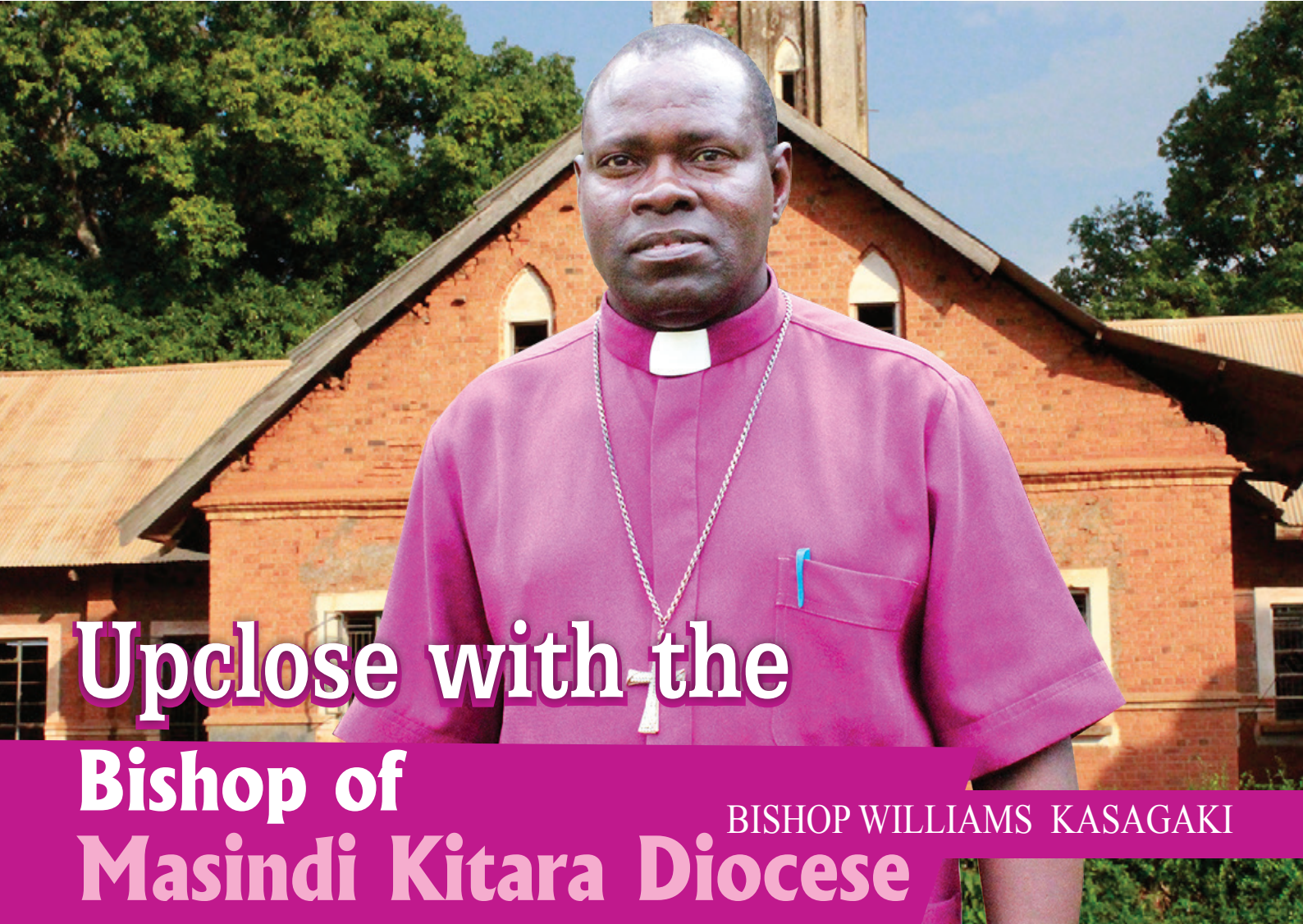

Upclose with the Bishop of Masindi Kitara Diocese

BISHOP WILLIAMS KASAGAKI

This year, team research family linked up with the Bishop of Masindi Kitara Diocese. It was nice to meet this lovely man of God. We had a number of issues we talked about with him but most importantly, we learnt something from this kind hearted man of God. Here is what we shared.

BISHOP: Oh! You are welcome, good after noon my dear children, you are welcome once again in my office, you can have seats.

IN CHOROUS: Good afternoon sir, thank you.

EDWIN MAY: Thanks once again, I am called Sonny Edwin May, Senior three in Kigumba intensive secondary school, the vice president writers club of the school and with me are some of the members of the club who all seem to be glad to have a close range interaction with you for the very first time. As, we have a few questions for you of which each of us shall ask .Am sure everybody here is anxious to get answers from you. But first let them introduce themselves.

(All members in the visiting team introduced themselves)

BISHOP: Well, that's great you are welcome.

EDWIN MAY: Ok, we would like to know your biography sir! Especially the education back ground.

BISHOP: Wao!!! Actually, I began my primary one in 1969-1976, I joined secondary in 1977-1980. From 1980, I got a call from ordained ministry for one year then I got saved in that very year (1980). I underwent theological training in 1982-1984, and was awarded a certificate in theology. On 9th December 1984, I was ordained. After ordination certificate, I worked as a training leader/ lay leader in the cathedral. In 1986-1988, I did a diploma in theology at Bishop Tucker University, awarded by Makerere University and a bachelor's degree in divinity at the same University still awarded by Makerere University. In 2000-2001 I did a post Graduate Diploma in Education. In 2007-2008, I went to UK to study masters in arts at Gloucester University. I taught in very many schools like Masindi secondary school A 'level. In 2009, I also worked at Uganda Christian University because they wanted people of my caliber by then. On August 2012 I was nominated as a religious leader in the diocese. I am a Munyoro by tribe; my mother is a Musambo from Toro and father a Musita from Bunyoro

EDWIN MAY: What does it take for one to become a bishop?

BISHOP: It takes a lot for one to become a bishop. Your spiritual life matters a lot and academics as well. You must have at least the first degree. You should also be above forty five years of age. But most important, your spiritual life.



EDWIN MAY: What challenges have you met in this work and how have you overcome them?

BISHOP: Hmmm, the work is not easy as you may think. It needs hard work as am always demanded in several occasions like marriages, confirmation, baptism etc. There is also a huge project plan going on i.e.; construction of the new cathedral. I have overcome them by creating church projects and delegating roles to some of the people I work with and we are managing well though its difficult.

TRENA: How do you spend your leisure?

BISHOP: Ok, I like listening to church music and when I was in my youth, I couldn't miss church music festivals, and particularly I also spend leisure watching football and Arsenal is my favorite team.

TRENA: Our theme is "it's your responsibility" what responsibility has the church taken in helping the youth not to derail their lives from the required norm of life.

BISHOP: As a church, we have set up youth conferences, preaching the gospel to the youth, we also have chaplaincy in schools. Especially in C.O.U schools. This has helped us monitor their spiritual life, counseling and guiding them as well.

TRENA: It's commonly believed in the society that most of the very religious people are poor yet in the public face (eye) others seem to be doing well. What is your opinion about that?

BISHOP: Well, being rich or poor differs from the churches. As salary is not all that given to us thew servants but only taken. We just sacrifice

ourselves to serve God.

EMMA: Does being bishop affect you in any way.

BISHOP: No, I believe it's a divine call for one to be a Bishop and I don't regret it in any way in fact I feel am responding to God's call. Well it's a task that

EMMA: Street preaching is becoming so common in towns. Do you support it, what do you say about that?

BISHOP: It's fine. But the person preaching matters and also the place. It's not limited to a person provided you are born again.

EMMA: How can one live to be holy in spirit.

BISHOP: the first thing to do is to seek the kingdom of God and the rest will follow as the bible says. To be holy in spirit, one should also read the Bible meditatively as a believer, in other words the bible should be our mirror.

ACHOLA: what challenges have you faced in converting people from witch craft or traditional religions to our Godly faith? What advice do you have for them?

BISHOP: well, in Uganda those who don't go to church are estimated to be 0.2 percent, in most cases we don't have those categories. However, the sense is that we get such people to accept God as their personal savior and we do advice such people to be devoted Christians, to live life of Christianity and also know that there is no other God apart from the almighty.

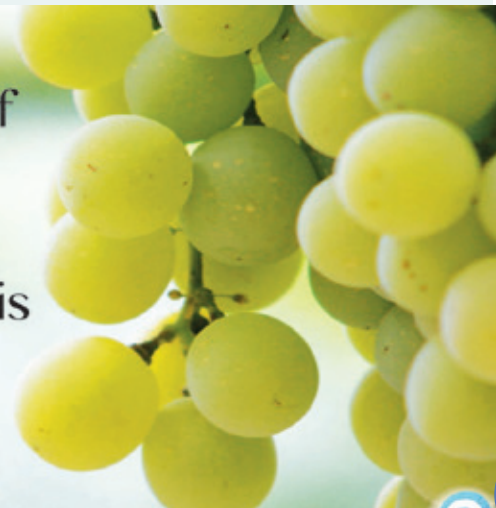

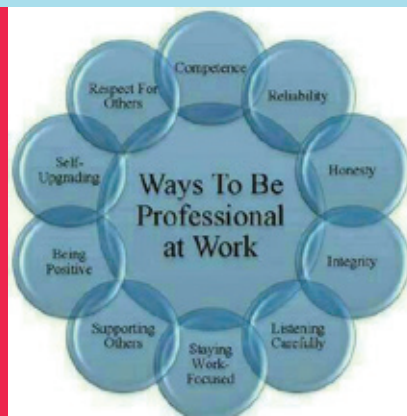

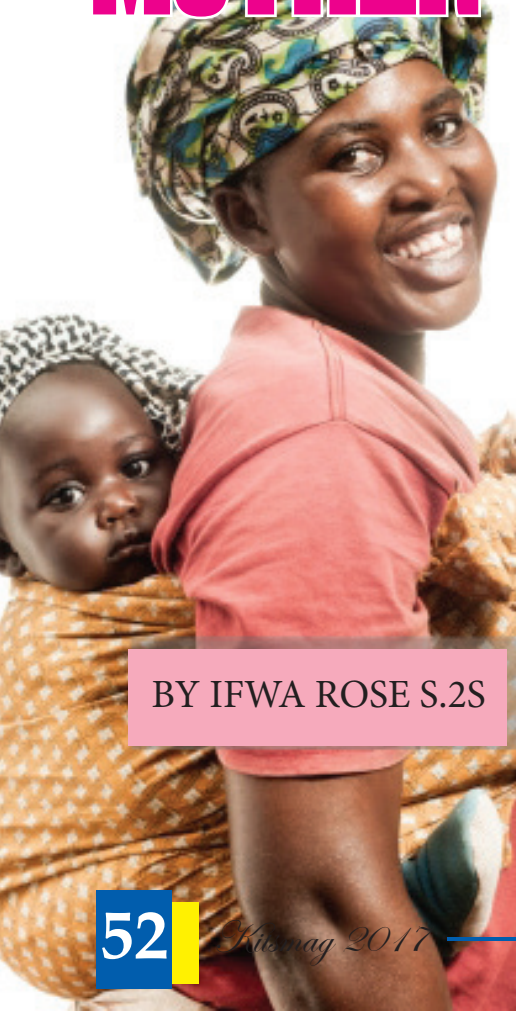

The novel's protagonist Okonkwo is famous in the surrounding villages for being a wrestling champion, defeating a wrestler nicknamed "the cat" (because he never lands on his back). He is strong, hard-working, and strives to show no weakness. Okonkwo wants to dispel his father Unoka's tainted legacy of unpaid debts, a neglected wife and children, and cowardice at the sight of blood. Okonkwo works to build his wealth entirely on his own, as Unoka died a shameful death and left many unpaid debts. He is also obsessed with his masculinity, and any slight compromise on this is swiftly destroyed. As a result, he is brusque with his three wives, children, and neighbours, and is wealthy, courageous, and powerful among the people of his village. He is a leader of his village, and he has attained a position in his society for which he has striven all his life.[2]

Okonkwo is selected by the elders to be the guardian of Ikemefuna, a boy taken by the village as a peace settlement between Umuofia and another village after Ikemefuna's father killed an Umuofian woman. The boy lives with Okonkwo's family and Okonkwo grows fond of him. The boy looks up to Okonkwo and considers him a second father. The Oracle of Umuofia eventually pronounces that the boy must be killed. Ezeudu, the oldest man in the village,

The Oracle of Umuofia eventually pronounces that the boy must be killed. Ezeudu, the oldest man in the village, warns Okonkwo that he should have nothing to do with the murder because it would be like killing his own child -

warns Okonkwo that he should have nothing to do with the murder because it would be like killing his own child - but to avoid seeming weak and feminine to the other men of the village, Okonkwo disregards the warning from the old man, striking the killing blow himself even as Ikemefuna begs his "father" for protection. For many days after killing Ikemefuna, Okonkwo feels guilty and saddened. Shortly after Ikemefuna's death, things begin to go wrong for Okonkwo. His sickly daughter Ezinma falls unexpectedly ill and it is feared she may die; during a gun salute at Ezeudu's funeral, Okonkwo's gun accidentally explodes and kills Ezeudu's son. He and his family are sent into exile for seven years to appease the gods he has offended.

While Okonkwo is away in Mbanta, he learns that white men are living in Umuofia with the intent of introducing their religion, Christianity. As the number of converts

increases, the foothold of the white people grows and a new government is introduced. The village is forced to respond with either appeasement or resistance to the imposition of the white people's nascent society.

Returning from exile, Okonkwo finds his village changed by the presence of the white men. After a convert commits a heinous act by unmasking an elder as he embodies an ancestral spirit of the clan, the village retaliates by destroying a local Christian church. In return, the leader of the white government takes them prisoner and holds them for a ransom of two hundred cowries for a short while, further humiliating and insulting the native leaders, doing things such as shaving their heads and whipping them. As a result, the people of Umuofia finally gather for what could be a great uprising. Okonkwo, a warrior by nature and adamant about following Umuofian custom and tradition, despises any form of cowardice and advocates war against the white men. When messengers of the white government try to stop the meeting, Okonkwo beheads one of them. Because the crowd allows the other messengers to escape, and does not fight with Okonkwo he realizes with despair that the people of Umuofia are not going to fight to protect themselves — his society's response to such a conflict, which for so long had been predictable and dictated by tradition, is changing.

When the local leader of the white government comes to Okonkwo's house to take him to court, he finds that Okonkwo has hanged himself to avoid being tried in a colonial court. Among his own people, Okonkwo's actions have tarnished his reputation and status, as it is strictly against the teachings of the Igbo to commit suicide.

Time for break, he is the one to remind the time keeper but complains the break time is given few minutes. Time for reading in the evening preps, he is seen reading magazines and newspapers.

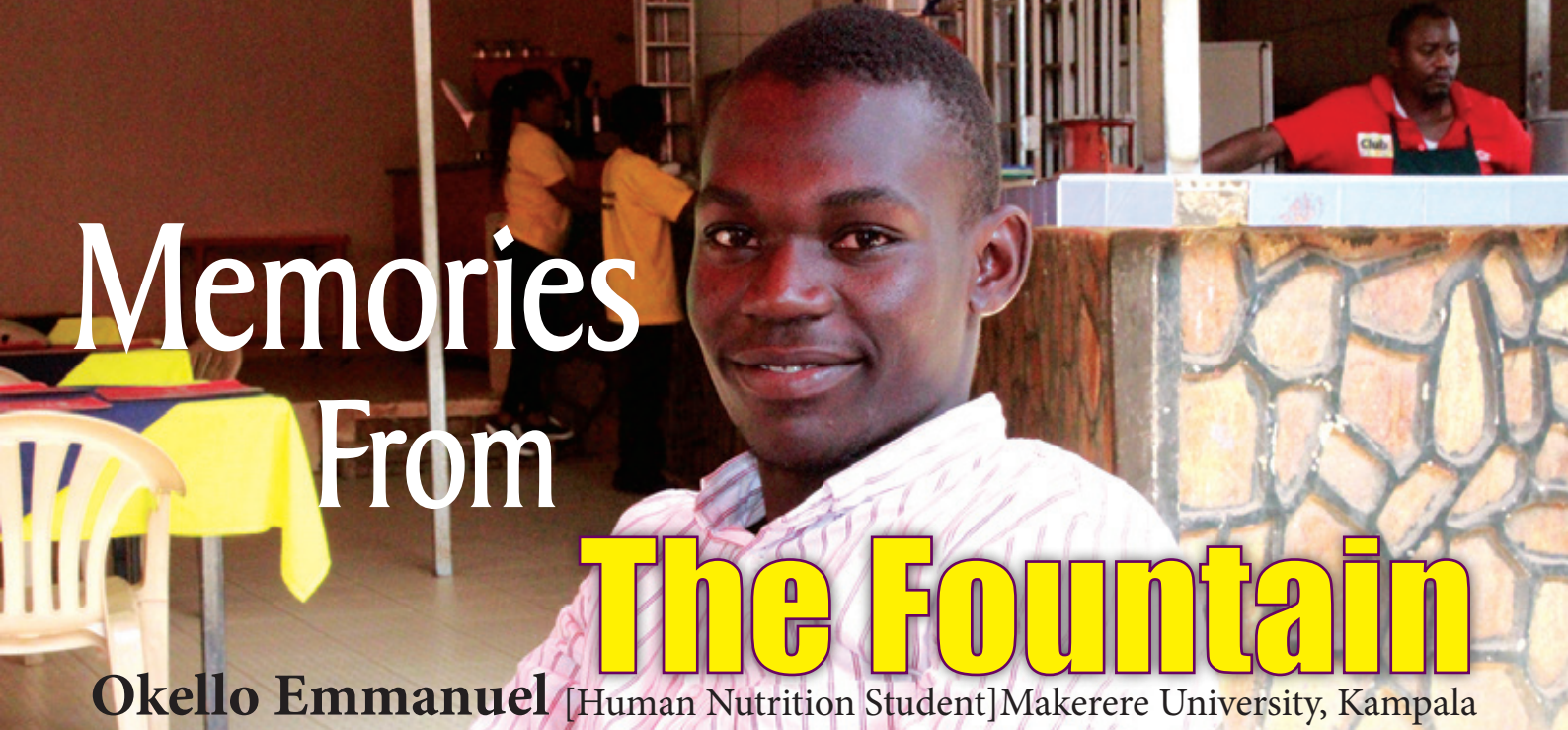
When time for exams comes, he is happy because he is going home but never concerned of what he is going to write in the exams.

Memories From

The Fountain

The fountain here is Kigumba intensive S.S (KISS). I call it fountain because it is a spring from which intelligence plus character- the true goal of education are provided. I had all my secondary education (s.1 to s.6) at KISS between 2010 and 2015. This article summarizes my journey at this spring-trying to give the facts as they unfolded. I am glad the Editor-In Chief allowed me this honor and space in this edition of the KISMAG.

As March 2010 approached, I was nervous and excited. My short primary vacation was coming to an end and I was set to join Intensive an outspoken school in the region. There were tales that you would never spend a day without being caned. That scared hell out of me. But that wasn't close to true. I arrived at the school with my dad on a hot afternoon. So many metallic cases were at the gate-most looking brand new with brand new mattresses too (some still in their polythene). The first few hours had strong impressions on me. The gateman seemed as principled as my primary head teacher, the students seemed so serious. Everyone looked busy. The doctrines of the institution seemed to exist in easy harmony. I was sent back to town to have my hair reduced to zero inches (despite having shaved the previous day while at home). Dad handed me a 5,000Ush note as pocket money and left. He told me to use this money carefully. I knew this was a lot of money then. I was happy to meet some old boys on day one. I learnt that these continued checking on me time after time. The visits however reduced with time. I later learnt that this was because my ODI was done. A rich man has countless friends. In those times, our wealth was by how much ODI we had. Lessons begun soon and the class was big-with over 200. Our class room was made of both makoko(wood) and papyrus. This meant it had to be so cold during preps or rain would also get into the classroom. You would easily be disrupted and look outside during a lesson. If one was too hungry at lunch time, they didn't use the door but simply moved through the papyrus; soon the class was half open. The sitting arrangement was on a first-come-first-sit basis. Some friends however sat at the back whether they had entered class first. We had to introduce ourselves while in class-our names, previous schools, future aspirations. Many said they wanted to become doctors, lawyers, pilots, nurses, business men....etc. We set out to meet our dreams. Even though morning preps weren't compulsory for S.1 then, most of us deliberately woke up to brave the cold. One morning I read all we had covered in about five different subjects so I was forced to borrow books from S.2 to read ahead. Later on we got our uniforms-the trade mark purple shirt and navy blue trousers. This had become a third pair of trousers for me. I remember one morning I was sent home (Kiryandongo town) for a fees balance. I borrowed transport (1,000/=). I found dad having breakfast and he promptly gave me the fees, and 4,000/= as wallet money. 3,000/= had to be shared between me and my brother and 1000/= transport back to school. I remember finding the same teacher in class on returning to school. In astonishment, the chemistry teacher then (AP-PARATUS as we called him) asked me to narrate my journey to the class. It was exhilarating. We had progressively been introduced into the school culture-"intensiveness". Discipline was not a choice but a doctrine. Smartness was a rule. First term soon ended. Many of us had excelled-often scoring 100% in most of the subjects. I remember 19 of us had 99% in Biology. Maybe most of us wanted to become doctors? Our names were read out aloud at the parade in front of everyone at the end of the term and awarded money best-for-each subject. I won 8,000/=, the highest money I had ever owned at a single time all my life then. I was too happy. I had been energized to work harder the next term. Such was the motivation then. But what motivates one now that students have a lot of money?

My parents shifted to Kigumba town during the holidays so I became a day scholar for the next terms. This meant no more morning preps for me. I didn't like this bit. However, I maintained my place among the top 3. One guy in particular beat me with his intelligence and focus-Ohisa Johnson, so I tried to befriend him though I didn't succeed much. He had one friend-his books. The subsequent journey was thrilling. Our class-which came to be known as-THE AMERICANS with its president-Mr.OBAMA became the most notorious in the school. The pressure from peers grew. But I was too scared for the school regulations-let alone my no nonsense dad. In fact at one moment the director

MR. ASIMWE GILBERT came in to handle us himself. At that time I both feared and admired him. He seemed too principled to befriend with our recklessness. He had an iron hand yet seemed to inspire us at the same time. I vividly recall the "carrots" which were given to students who answered certain questions. One morning we were scheduled to miss breakfast if no one described how a six's thermometer worked. We were just in S.2 remember. I saved the class. His favorite reference was a straight talk calendar phrase that hung in the classroom that read, "What you do today determines what you will be in future." The tales with which we were taught stimulated my imagination and usually contained some moral lesson. I was to be known as professor by my friends. I honestly liked it. The name gave me a challenge.

S.4 was approaching. Luckily for me I was always on bursary so I had little time thinking of expiry dates on fees cards. Sometimes I did anyway. One day I wasn't ready to miss class, so one good guy forged and extended my expiry date. I was however scared Mr. Alier (then deputy HM) would know, so I still moved out. I was not a confident liar anyway. It's partly for these bursaries that I shall always remain indebted to this great institution. I shall forever remain grateful.

S.4 was full of activity-tests, revision, exams, general caning, group discussion and the like. Books ran our lives then. Time ran so fast. Mocks were approaching. And so was UCE. Our goal was to be the best in the country; I hoped to attain 8 in 8. Fate would not have that for us. That's a challenge for those who still have a chance. It's a challenge I emphasize. By these times, some of our dreams had changed; Either due to reality by the actions we chose earlier or what we actually thought we should be. I was in the latter. I now wanted to be an Engineer. I wanted to be involved in the oil industry my country was to embark on in the future. This indeed informed my decision to offer PCM/ICT for the first two weeks at A level-of course against the will of the family. The managing director in particular gave me an ultimatum-to either do Biology or change school. How did I want to waste the Doctor in me? He wondered. I had one choice since I was on bursary. I changed to BCM and as they say, the rest is history. Books were more serious. My first girlfriend was Biology. I knew if I wanted to be a doctor, she was to deliver me to that Promised Land. And you;- who is your girlfriend? Will she deliver you to that land you envi-

sion yourself or drift you away from it? I became married to chemistry and Mathematics. My small world revolved around the classroom, staff room, library, dormitory and kitchen. I knew this was the first step in a staircase to a destined path. Teachers became our libraries, just like the library became our teacher. We had discussions anywhere. Sometimes on the lines during meal time. I often discussed with Soro David (a medical student now) as we slept since he slept above me. We would discuss as we moved around the school, setting small exams for ourselves. Each minute was equally important. Whether we had been committed to our books during the 6 years would be a result of our performance at this level. We sat our exams and still we excelled. In spite of the frustrations, I had dream, you have one too. Don't let it die; live in that dream-that's how it will become a reality. A new world opened for me-surely, a better one will open for you too. You just have to work on it. We are the sum total of our decisions and thoughts. Looking back, I was just a little boy when I first got into Intensive gates and would truly remain one for many years. And looking ahead, the seed was carefully planted, germinated and is growing. It will grow bigger. Cultivate yours too.

What Does The Bible Say About Education? A Christian Study Does the Bible say anything about education? It most certainly does and here's a Christian study on the subject of education.

Moses, the Educated

The Bible is pro-education but it must be tied to godly wisdom or it turns out to be foolishness. Just a quick reading of the proverbs tells us that. Moses was no exception as it was written of him "At this time Moses was born; and he was beautiful in God's sight. And he was brought up for three months in his father's house, and when he was exposed, Pharaoh's daughter adopted him and brought him up as her own son. And Moses was instructed in all the wisdom of the Egyptians, and he was mighty in his words and deeds" (Acts 7:20-22). This education served Moses well when he started to help administer the civil laws and codes for the nation of Israel. He also acted as a judge for the people. The science, law, architecture, writing, history, mathematics, and other

disciplines were all part of the educational system of Egypt and must have come in handy for his dealings with Israel in the Wilderness. The building of the tabernacle, the writing of the laws and codes, the sanitation laws, and so on would have been next to impossible if Moses had not been highly educated.

Proverbs 1:7 "The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge; but fools despise wisdom and instruction."

Paul, the Scholar and Philosopher

Paul studied under one of the most brilliant men of all time. His name was Gamaliel. Paul said of himself that he was "a Jew, born in Tarsus in Cilicia, but brought up in this city, educated at the feet of Gamaliel according to the strict manner of the law of our fathers, being zealous for God as all of you are this day" (Acts 7:3). Paul continued in his writings to the church at Philippi saying "If anyone else thinks he has reason for confidence in the flesh, I have more: circumcised on the eighth day, of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew of Hebrews; as to the law, a Pharisee; as to zeal, a persecu-

tor of the church; as to righteousness under the law, blameless" (Phil 3:4b-6). Paul, according to early church historians and biblical scholars, may have been the greatest mind of his time. Few could out-whit him, out-debate him and exceed his knowledge of the law and of the Scriptures. If education was bad, then why did God use Paul as one of the greatest of all apologists and Bible (Old Testament) scholars, specifically when he reasoned with the Greeks from their own poets on Mar's Hill (Acts 7:22-34)? Wouldn't you have loved to hear that message?

Solomon's Wisdom

The Book of Proverbs, Song of Solomon and the Book of Ecclesiastes, were all called "wisdom literature" and for good reason. Solomon is also known to have written some of the psalms as well. There was such godly wisdom in these books. Why? It was because Solomon prayed to God for wisdom (1 Kings 3:9) and not for riches or honor so God gave him both (1 Kings 3:11). This prayer for wisdom was very pleasing to God because there is more value in education, particularly regarding the fear of the Lord, than there is in all the gold mines and treasure houses

in the world. It was said that “Solomon’s wisdom surpassed the wisdom of all the people of the east and all the wisdom of Egypt” (1 Kings 4:30). In fact, he “was greater in riches and wisdom than all the other kings of the earth” (1 Kings 10:23). He said to himself “I have increased in wisdom more than anyone who has ruled over Jerusalem before me; I have experienced much of wisdom and knowledge” (Eccl 1:16).

The Wisdom of Daniel

Daniel was only a teenager when he was brought into captivity with the rest of the captives of Israel. It was said of Daniel that “In every matter of wisdom and understanding about which the king questioned them, he found them ten times better than all the magicians and enchanters in his whole kingdom” (Dan 1:20). There were 3 men in particular and 4 counting Daniel of which it was said “God gave them learning and skill in all literature and wisdom, and Daniel had understanding in all visions and dreams” (Dan 1:17). Daniel’s wisdom or education exceeded that of everyone in Nebuchadnezzar’s kingdom of Babylon, over and above that of the magicians and enchanters, specifically in the “whole kingdom” and not just slightly over them but “ten times better!” It’s no wonder then that “the king gave Daniel high honors and many

great gifts, and made him ruler over the whole province of Babylon and chief prefect over all the wise men of Babylon” (Dan 2:48). King Nebuchadnezzar would have never put someone in charge of Babylon that was not qualified to run such a mammoth and complex nation if he didn’t feel that he wasn’t educationally qualified to do so.

The Bible on Education or Wisdom

Proverbs 1:7 “The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge: but fools despise wisdom and instruction.” Clearly, knowledge begins and ends with the fear of the Lord, which means a deep, abiding, holy reverential fear and respect.

Proverbs 24:3-7 “By wisdom a house is built, and by understanding it is established; by knowledge the rooms are filled with all precious and pleasant riches. A wise man is full of strength, and a man of knowledge enhances his might, for by wise guidance you can wage your war, and in abundance of counselors there is victory. Wisdom is too high for a fool; in the gate he does not open his mouth.”

It takes godly wisdom to build and have understanding to be established and it is only by knowledge that true riches are acquired and the true riches are found not only in the wisdom literature but in the whole Word of

God, starting in Genesis 1:1 to Revelation 22:21. In between these pages you will find no greater wisdom, education, and knowledge in the entire world.

Conclusion

James reminds us that education or wisdom, not exactly the same thing, can be received by God as he writes “If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, that giveth to all [men] liberally, and upbraids not; and it shall be given him” (James 1:5) however the “wisdom of the world is foolishness to God” (1 Cor 3:19) but godly wisdom is of great value. I have heard of many an educated fool. God mocks the educated fools of the earth through Paul writing “Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the debater of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world” (1 Cor 1:20). In time God “will destroy the wisdom of the wise” (1 Cor 1:19) for it was by “Professing themselves to be wise, they became fools” (Rom 1:22). It is better to seek “the wisdom from above [which] is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, open to reason, full of mercy and good fruits, impartial and sincere” (James 3:17)

4 Great Ways to Lead a Prayerful, Sincere Life as Secondary school student

1. Find a Spiritual Guide

Christianity is not a religion meant for the individual—we're meant to be in communion with Christ, and that includes His Body. It's so important to having an authentically Christian life to live within the community of believers (and yes, that includes the ones you don't like or don't get along with, too). But all relationships within the Church are not equal: having Christ-centered peers is imperative, but having a spiritual guide, someone who is further along the path than you, who sees you in a different light than you see yourself, who can understand your struggles and show you the right direction, is essential to a healthy spiritual life. You really can't do this for yourself. It's just not possible. It's like trying to be married to yourself—it doesn't make any sense, doesn't allow for love of another, and it's a bit delusional.

Having a spiritual guide is way more than having someone to go to when you mess up. It's about seeking after someone who lives a godly life in a manner you can strive to imitate. One my dearest spiritual guides is a mother who exemplifies Christian love and prayer in the way she wipes up boogers, does her dishes, and greets her guests. She's someone whose threshold I cross as often as is possible, whose narratives and proverbs I cling to.

2. Try Not to Make Excuses

It can be so easy and so tempting in the midst of life's goings-on to start to make little excuses on not-so-little things. We tell ourselves, "It's been such a busy week, and I have so much going on right now, there's just no way I could make it to church/wake up and pray/go to OCF/etc.," or we tell ourselves, "We're all human. Everybody makes mistakes. That little one I made was really no big deal in the grand scheme of things. It could've been way worse." The latter excuse sounds a lot like some guy we're gonna hear about this Sunday in church, and let's just say, that he's not the guy we want to imitate. The problem with the former excuse is that, over time, a one-time thing becomes a habit. If we're willing to make the excuse occasionally, we're likely to slip into habitual laziness and forgetfulness.

Now, this isn't saying there aren't legitimate reasons that one might miss church, but our priorities have to be in order, and we have to be truly honest as to what our motivations are. Being honest with where we are and not making excuses for ourselves and our mistakes requires a constant process of reevaluating ourselves and our intentions (see #1 for assistance in this area).

3. Focus on Yourself

Every person is on their own journey, even those of

us in the Church who are trying to follow the one True Way. It is completely fruitless, then, to compare yourself to other people or spend time mulling over what everyone else is or isn't doing or try to "fix" other people. Just don't do it. It's the beginning of judgement of others, despair, and spiritual delusion. We only have complete dominion over our own thoughts, words, and actions, and it is there that we should focus our time and energy. I always remind myself that I have enough problems and passions hiding in the corners of my heart to last me a lifetime; there's no time for me to wonder why someone else is eating meat on a Friday.

4. Have Hope

I think a particular struggle of college students today is the feeling that the world has become overwhelmingly bad and that we are helpless to do anything about it. People can seem so divided against one another over the smallest of things, and yet we are constantly told to use our own virtue and skill (yikes) to help heal humanity. But the truth is God is always present, and it is He who cares for all things—from our tiniest personal struggles to the wars and rumors of wars that plague our world. Offer up earnest prayer on behalf of all, and take solace in the words of the psalmist.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES OF ISLAMIC EDUCATION

The Arabic language has three terms for education, representing the various dimensions of the educational process as perceived by Islam. The most widely used word for education in a formal sense is ta'lim, from the root 'alima (to know, to be aware, to perceive, to learn), which is used to denote knowledge being sought or imparted through instruction and teaching. Tarbiyah, from the root raba (to increase, to grow, to rear), implies a state of spiritual and ethical nurturing in accordance with the will of God. Ta'dib, from the root aduba (to be cultured, refined, well-mannered), suggests a person's development of sound social behavior. What is meant by sound requires a deeper understanding of the Islamic conception of the human being.

Education in the context of Islam is regarded as a process that involves the complete

person, including the rational, spiritual, and social dimensions. As noted by Syed Muhammad al-Naquib al-Attas in 1979, the comprehensive and integrated approach to education in Islam is directed toward the "balanced growth of the total personality...through training Man's spirit, intellect, rational self, feelings and bodily senses...such that faith is infused into the whole of his personality" (p. 158). In Islamic educational theory knowledge is gained in order to actualize and perfect all dimensions of the human being. From an Islamic perspective the highest and most useful model of perfection is the prophet Muhammad, and the goal of Islamic education is that people be able to live as he lived. Seyyed Hossein Nasr wrote in 1984 that while education does prepare humankind for happiness in this life, "its ultimate goal is the abode of permanence and all education points to the permanent world of eternity" (p. 7). To ascertain truth by reason alone is restrictive, according to Islam, because spiritual and temporal reality are

two sides of the same sphere. Many Muslim educationists argue that avouring reason at the expense of spirituality interferes with balanced growth. Exclusive training of the intellect, for example, is inadequate in developing and refining elements of love, kindness, compassion, and selflessness, which have an altogether spiritual ambience and can be engaged only by processes of spiritual training.

Education in Islam is twofold: acquiring intellectual knowledge (through the application of reason and logic) and developing spiritual knowledge (derived from divine revelation and spiritual experience). According to the worldview of Islam, provision in education must be made equally for both. Acquiring knowledge in Islam is not intended as an end but as a means to stimulate a more elevated moral and spiritual consciousness, leading to faith and righteous action.

1. Passion & Motivation: If there's one word that describes the fundamental trait in an entrepreneurship, it would be passion.

- o Is there something that you can work on over and over again, without getting bored?
- o Is there something that keeps you awake because you have not finished it yet?
- o Is there something that you have built and want to continue to improve upon, again and again?
- o Is there something that you enjoy the most and want to continue doing for the rest of your life?

Your demonstration of passion and motivation

will determine your success in any entrepreneurial venture. From building and implementing a prototype, to pitching your idea to venture capitalists, success is a function of passion and determination.

2. Entrepreneurs are risk takers ready to dive deep into a future of uncertainty. But not all risk takers are successful entrepreneurs. What differentiates a successful entrepreneur from the rest in terms of risk? Successful entrepreneurs are willing to risk time and money on unknowns, but they also keep resources, plans and bandwidth for dealing with "unknown unknowns" in reserve. When evaluating risk, a successful entrepreneur will ask him/herself, is this risk worth the cost of my career, time and money? And, what will I do if this venture doesn't pay off?

3. Self-belief, Hard work & Disciplined Dedication: Entrepreneurs enjoy what they do. They believe in themselves and are confident and dedicated to their project. Occasionally, they may show

stubbornness in their intense focus on and faith in their idea. But the flip side is their demonstrated discipline and dedication.

4. Adaptability & Flexibility: It's good to be passionate or even stubborn about what you do. But being inflexible about client or market needs will lead to failure. Remember, an entrepreneurial venture is not simply about doing what you believe is good, but also making successful business out of it. Market needs are dynamic: changes are a recurring phenomenon. Successful entrepreneurs welcome all suggestions for optimization or customization that enhances their offering and satisfies client and market needs. A product you develop for yourself alone may qualify as a hobby, but a product for the market should satisfy market needs.

5. Understand Your Offering – And Its Market: Entrepreneurs know their product offering inside and out. They also know the marketplace and its dynamics inside and out. Remaining unaware of changing market needs, competitor moves and other external factors can bring even great products to failure.

6. Accountability/Financial Management: It takes time to get to profitability for any entrepreneurial venture. Till then, capital is limited and needs to be utilized wisely. Successful entrepreneurs realize this mandatory financial management requirement and plan for present and future financial obligations (with some additional buffer). Even after securing funding or going fully

What do successful entrepreneurs do? They reach out to mentors with more experience and extensive networks to seek valuable advice.

Having such networking abilities, including

more experienced mentors, is a key characteristics of successful entrepreneurs.

9. Being Prepared to Take the Exit: Not every attempt will result in success. The failure rate of entrepreneurial ventures is very high. At times, it is absolutely fine to take the "practical" exit route and try something new, instead of continuing to make sunk cost investments in the same venture. Many famous entrepreneurs weren't successful the first time around. But they had the serenity and foresight to know when to cut their losses.

You may ask yourself, am I an entrepreneur? And the very question may put you in doubt about the answer. Even if you don't have the flair of Steve Jobs or the hair of Elon Musk, if you have the courage to ask yourself intimidating questions – Can I do this? Do I want to do this? – you have the stuff to be an entrepreneur.

Conclusively, Personal qualities and their correct demonstration with the right stakeholders are the determining factors for success or failure as an entrepreneur. A realistic self-assessment checklist against these suggested guidelines will ensure you take the right steps in the right direction to succeed.

How to grow cabbage in Uganda

Cabbage Garden in Uganda

Whatever your quest for cabbage is in Africa, please take time to read through our farming guide for answers; you could be just a few clicks away to a successful vegetable growing career in Uganda...!

Grown even in the roman days, cabbage is one of the most popular vegetables grown for cooking and other uses around the world. The leafy vegetable is part of the brassica genus, and it grows best in partial shade, in firm, fertile free draining soil. Cabbage comes in a variety of green shades, as well as purple or red. The shape of the head varies as well. In about 60-70 days you could be able to harvest your cabbage depending on the variety.

On this Uganda plant guide we share some useful info about growing Cabbages in Africa, including;

How to classify cabbage in Uganda

Cabbages are normally classified according to the duration of time they take to mature;

Early cabbages- these include golden Acer which matures in 65 days, and red express which matures in 63 days.

Midseason types these include baby cabbage which takes about 71 days to grow.

And lastly is the late season types like Red cabbage which looks like the Red Acer and takes 75 days to mature.

What your cabbages need to grow

Cabbages prefer well drained, fertile soils high in organic matter, and with a PH between 6.0-7.5. They can however tolerate slightly alkaline soil. Cabbages are

heavy feeders and as such yours will also need plenty and consistent moisture.



How to plant your cabbage

Prepare your soil for seeds or seedling by digging it over with a garden fork, then rake it to make a fine seed bed. Your Cabbage will need firm soil base to keep their roots anchored because cabbage heads are heavy.

You can sow along a single row or along staggered wide rows. Use spacing of 12-18 inches wide and 16-18 inches between rows. Ensure to harden off seedlings to prepare them for planting.

How to fertilize and weed your cabbages

Fertilize your plants when growing especially after transplanting and then add nitrogen when the cabbage is half grown.

Always weed your cabbage vegetable garden as the need arises to control grass and other weeds because cabbage is a shallow rooted crop, and its cultivation is shallow.

Chemicals are available for weed control and generally perform very satisfactorily.

How best to Harvest your cabbage in Africa

Cabbages are harvested by cutting through the stem; just above ground level with a sharp knife. If you want to get the highest yields, cut the cabbage's head when it is solid (firm to hand pressure), but before it cracks or splits when head are matures. Sudden heavy rains may cause cabbage heads to crack or split wide open.

Quick Tips for Planting your Cabbage in Africa

- On a well prepared seed bed or germination tray open up holes in a row
- Sow seeds 1-2 cm deep and rows should be spaced 15 cm apart
- Water the seeds to provide the moisture needed for germination
- Seed germination will be seen 4-7 days after planting
- Thin seedlings to 7.5 cm between each plant after germination
- Harden off seedlings in preparation for transplanting
- Cabbage is ready for transplanting when the seedlings are between 6-8 cm high
- Water your main garden the day before when you plan moving the seedlings next day, and keep them well watered until established.
- Mulch, mulch...Cabbages do love moist soils to thrive best, this also keeps away weeds.
- Harvest after the recommended days of growing.

UGANDA PROFILE - TIMELINE BY OTIM HILLARY S.4 2017

A chronology of key events:

1500 - Bito dynasties of Buganda, Bunyoro and Ankole founded by Nilotic-speaking immigrants from present-day south eastern Sudan.

Capital: Kampala

City is spread over a series of hills

1890: HQ of British colonial administration

1962: Capital of independent Uganda

Population: 1.2m

1700 - Buganda begins to expand at the expense of Bunyoro.

1800 - Buganda controls territory bordering Lake Victoria from the Victoria Nile to the Kagera river.

1840s - Muslim traders from the Indian Ocean coast exchange firearms, cloth and beads for the ivory and slaves of Buganda.

1862 - British explorer John Hanning Speke becomes the first European to visit Buganda.

1875 - Bugandan King Mutesa I allows Christian missionaries to enter his realm.

British influence

1877 - Members of the British Missionary Society arrive in Buganda.

1879 - Members of the French Roman Catholic

White Fathers arrive.

1890 - Britain and Germany sign treaty giving Britain rights to what was to become Uganda.

1892 - Imperial British East Africa Company agent Frederick Lugard extends the company's control to southern Uganda and helps the Protestant missionaries to prevail over their Catholic counterparts in Buganda.

1894 - Uganda becomes a British protectorate.

1900 - Britain signs agreement with Buganda giving it autonomy and turning it into a constitutional monarchy controlled mainly by Protestant chiefs.

1902 - The Eastern province of Uganda trans-

ferred to the Kenya.

1904 - Commercial cultivation of cotton begins.

1921 - Uganda given a legislative council, but its first African member not admitted till 1945.

1963 - Uganda becomes a republic with Buganda's King Mutesa as president.

1966 - Milton Obote ends Buganda's autonomy and promotes himself to the presidency.

1967 - New constitution vests considerable power in the president.

Idi Amin years

1971 - Milton Obote toppled in coup led by Army chief Idi Amin.

1972 - Amin orders Asians who were not Ugandan citizens - around 60,000 people - to leave the country.

1972-73 - Uganda engages in border clashes with Tanzania.

1976 - Idi Amin declares himself president for life and claims parts of Kenya.

1978 - Uganda invades Tanzania with a view to annexing Kagera region.

1979 - Tanzania invades Uganda, unifying the various anti-Amin forces under the Uganda National Liberation Front and forcing Amin to flee the country; Yusufu Lule installed as president, but is quickly replaced by Godfrey Binaisa.

1980 - Binaisa overthrown by the army.

Milton Obote becomes president after elections.

1985 - Obote deposed in military coup and is replaced by Tito Okello.

1986 - National Resistance Army rebels take Kampala and install Yoweri Museveni as president.

Beginnings of recovery

1993 - Museveni restores the traditional kings, including the king of Buganda, but without political power.

1995 - New constitution legalises political parties but maintains the ban on political activity.

1996 - Museveni returned to office in Uganda's first direct presidential election.

1997 - Ugandan troops help depose Mobutu Sese Seko of Zaire, who is replaced by Laurent Kabila.

1998 - Ugandan troops intervene in the Democratic Republic of Congo on the side of rebels seeking to overthrow Kabila.

2000 - Ugandans vote to reject multi-party politics in favour of continuing Museveni's "no-party" system.

2001 January - East African Community (EAC) inaugurated in Arusha, Tanzania, laying groundwork for common East African passport, flag, economic and monetary integration. Members are Tanzania, Uganda and Kenya.

2001 March - Uganda classifies Rwanda, its former ally in the civil war in DR Congo, as a hostile nation because of fighting in 2000 between the

two countries' armies in DR Congo.

Museveni wins another term in office, beating his rival Kizza Besigye by 69% to 28%.

Campaign against rebels

2002 March - Sudan, Uganda sign agreement aimed at containing Ugandan rebel group the Lord's Resistance Army (LRA), active along common border.

2002 October - Army evacuates more than 400,000 civilians caught up in fight against cult-like LRA which continues its brutal attacks on villages.

2002 December - Peace deal signed with Uganda National Rescue Front (UNRF) rebels after more than five years of negotiations.

2003 May - Uganda pulls out last of its troops from eastern DR Congo. Tens of thousands of DR Congo civilians seek asylum in Uganda.

2004 February - LRA rebels slaughter more than 200 people at a camp for displaced people in the north.

2004 December - Government and LRA rebels hold their first face-to-face talks, but there is no breakthrough in ending the insurgency.

2005 April - Uganda rejects accusations made by DR Congo at the International Court in The Hague. DR Congo says Uganda invaded its territory in 1999, killing citizens and looting.

Multi-party politics

2005 July - Parliament approves a constitutional amendment which scraps presidential term limits.

Voters in a referendum overwhelmingly back a return to multi-party politics.



Resistance Army leader Joseph Kony

2005 October - International Criminal Court issues arrest warrants for five LRA commanders, including leader Joseph Kony.

2005 November - Main opposition leader Kizza Besigye is imprisoned shortly after returning from exile after a trial in a military court on various charges including treason and illegal possession of firearms. Supporters say the trial was politically motivated, and take to the streets. Mr Besigye is released on bail in January 2006, just ahead of presidential elections.

2005 December - International Court in The Hague rules that Uganda must compensate DR Congo for rights abuses and the plundering of resources in the five years leading to

2003.

2006 February - President Museveni wins multi-party elections, taking 59% of the vote against the 37% share of his rival, Kizza Besigye. EU observers highlight intimidation of Mr Besigye and official media bias as problems.

2006 August - The government and the LRA sign a truce aimed at ending their long-running conflict. Subsequent peace talks are marred by regular walk-outs.

2006 November - Government rejects a United Nations report accusing the army of using indiscriminate and excessive force in its campaign to disarm tribal warriors in the lawless northeastern region of Karamoja.

Somalia role

2007 March - Ugandan peacekeepers deploy in Somalia as part of an African Union mission to help stabilise the country.

The UN World Food Programme says it will have to halve food handouts to more than 1 million people displaced by war in the north.

2007 April - Protests over a rain forest explode into racial violence in Kampala, forcing police to protect Asian businesses and a Hindu temple. An Asian man and two other people are killed.

2007 July - Lord's Resistance Army says lack of funds for foreign travel and to reach commanders in remote hideouts will delay peace talks.

2007 August - Uganda and DR Congo agree to try defuse a border dispute.

2007 September - State of emergency imposed after severe floods cause widespread devastation.

2008 February - Government and the Lord's Resistance Army sign what is meant to be a permanent ceasefire at talks in Juba, Sudan.

2008 November - The leader of the Lord's Resistance Army, Joseph Kony, again fails to turn up for the signing of a peace agreement. Ugandan, South Sudanese and DR Congo armies launch offensive against LRA bases.

2009 January - Lord's Resistance Army appeals for ceasefire in face of continuing offensive by regional countries.

The UK oil explorer Heritage Oil says it has made a major oil find in Uganda.

2009 March - Ugandan army begins to withdraw from DR Congo, where it had pursued Lord's Resistance Army rebels.

2009 October - Somali Islamists threaten to target Uganda and Burundi after action by African peacekeepers in Somalia kills several civilians.

2009 December - Parliament votes to ban female circumcision. Anyone convicted of the practice will face 10 years in jail or a life sentence if a victim dies.

2010 January - President Museveni distances himself from the anti-homosexuality Bill, saying the ruling party MP who proposed the bill did so as an individual. The European Union and United States had condemned the bill. The Ugandan army says it killed Bok Abudemba, a senior commander of the Lord's Resistance Army armed group, in the Central African Republic.

2010 February - Heritage Oil sells its assets in Uganda to the UK firm Tullow Oil after Italian energy company Eni dropped out of the bidding.

2010 June - Public prosecutor opens corruption investigation against Vice-President Gilbert Bukenya, Foreign Minister Sam Kutesa and several other ministers and officials over the alleged theft of \$25m.

2010 June-August - Operation Rwenzori against ADF-NALU rebels striving for an Islamic state in Uganda prompts 90,000 to flee in North Kivu province of neighbouring DR Congo.

Blasts

2010 July - Two bomb attacks on people watching World Cup final at a restaurant and a rugby club in Kampala kill at least 74 people. The Somali Islamist group Al-Shabab says it was behind the blasts.

2010 August - National Resistance Movement primary elections for parliamentary and local candidates suspended amid irregularities, violence.



2010 October - UN report into killing of Hutus in DR Congo between 1993 and 2003 says they may constitute "crimes of genocide". It implicates Rwanda, Uganda, Burundi, Zimbabwe and Angola.

2010 October - Constitutional Court quashes treason charges against opposition leader Kizza Besigye.

2011 February - Museveni wins his fourth presidential election. Challenger Kizza Besigye alleges vote-rigging and dismisses the result as a sham.

2011 April - Kizza Besigye arrested several times over "walk-to-work" protests against rising prices.

2011 July - US deploys special forces personnel to help Uganda combat LRA rebels.

2011 September - Court orders release of LRA commander Thomas Kwoyelo, saying he should be given the amnesty on offer from

the government.

2012 May - Ugandan Army captures senior LRA commander Caesar Achellam in a clash in the Central African Republic, one of the nearby states in which the remaining band of LRA troops operates. Uganda says this is a major breakthrough, billing Achellam as a top LRA strategist.

Tens of thousands of refugees cross into Uganda, fleeing fighting in DR Congo.

DR Congo allegations

2012 July - UN accuses Uganda of sending troops into DR Congo to fight alongside the M23 rebel movement, a charge Uganda denies.

2012 November - Uganda announces its intention to withdraw from UN-backed international peacekeeping missions in response to UN accusations that Uganda is arming Congolese rebels.

Britain and other European countries halt aid channelled through the Ugandan government amid a scandal involving the alleged theft of donor funds.

2013 February - Eleven countries, including Uganda, sign a UN-mediated agreement pledging not to interfere in DR Congo.

2013 March - Uganda is grouped among the worst offenders in the illegal ivory trade at a meeting of CITES, the body regulating wildlife trade.

2013 May - Government temporarily shuts two newspapers after they published a letter suggesting President Museveni was grooming his son for power.

2013 November - Kampala Council ousts opposition Democratic Party Mayor Erias Lukwago over allegations of incompetence and abuse of office. The Democratic Party accuses the government of engineering the ouster of the opposition's most prominent elected representative.

2013 December - Parliament passes controversial anti-gay bill that increases the punishment for homosexual acts to include life imprisonment.

2014 February - President Museveni signs tough new anti-gay bill into law, drawing criticism from around the world.

The World Bank postpones a \$90m (£54m) loan to Uganda over the move, and the US imposes sanctions.

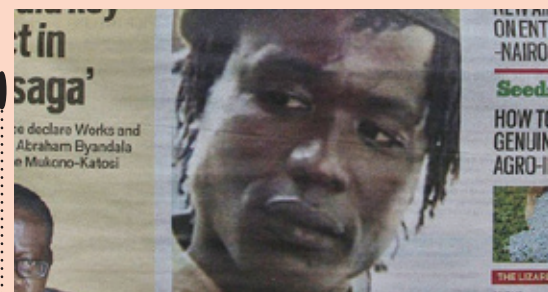
2014 July - Nearly 100 people die in clashes involving rival communities and the army in the western Rwenzori region.

2014 September - President Museveni sacks Prime Minister Amama Mbabazi.

2014 December - Renegade General David Sejusa, who fell out with President Museveni, unexpectedly returns from exile.

More than 1000 former fighters of the DR Congo rebel group M23 seek asylum in Uganda after government tries to repatriate them.

1 member of the Lord's Resistance Army to ap-



pear before the International Criminal Court. Two Muslim clerics killed by men on motorbikes. Police suspect the Islamist Allied Democratic Forces killed the two for discouraging people from joining the rebels.

2015 January - Dominic Ongwen becomes the first member of the Lord's Resistance Army to appear before the International Criminal Court.

2015 October - The head of Ugandan force in South Sudan says his troops will start withdrawing to make way for a regional force.

2016 February - President Museveni wins re-election against veteran candidate Kizza Besigye, amid opposition, Commonwealth, US and European Union concern about fairness and transparency.

2016 May - US delegation walks out of President Museveni's inauguration in protest at his disparaging comments about the International Criminal Court.

2016 July - Opposition leader Besigye is bailed after being held on treason charges for allegedly declaring himself president after elections.

2016 December - The first Lord's Resistance Army commander to appear before the International Criminal Court at The Hague goes on trial. Dominic Ongwen faces 70 counts of war crimes and crimes against humanity.

2016 November - Clashes between tribal king Charles Mumbere of Rwenzururu in western Uganda and security forces results in dozens of dead.

2017 January - President Museveni appoints his son, General Muhoozi Kainerugaba, as a presidential advisor.

2017 February - Four countries launch an intelligence centre in Uganda from which they will coordinate the fight against the rebel Allied Democratic Forces. The ADF started out with the aim of overthrowing President Museveni, but went on to absorb other rebel factions, and has carried out random massacres over two decades.

2017 April - Uganda withdraws its forces from the Central African Republic where it has been fighting the Lord's Resistance Army for the past five years.

2017 August - The UN says the number of South Sudanese refugees in Uganda has reached one million.

2017 September - MPs table a bill to remove the presidential age limit, prompting demonstrations by opponents.

Former South African President, P.W. Botha addresses cabinet in the Apartheid regime (Sunday times, Aug.18.1985) and lessons to learn as Africans.

We have demonstrated that to the blacks in 1001 ways. The republic of South Africa that we know of today has not been created by wishful thinking. We have created it at the expenses of intelligence, sweat and blood.....We don't pretend like other whites that we like the blacks.

Urinary Tract Infection: Causes, Symptoms, and Treatments

Urinary tract infections are caused by microbes such as bacteria overcoming the body's defenses in the urinary tract. They can affect the kidneys, bladder, and the tubes that run between them.

They are one of the most common types of infection and account for around 8.1 million visits to doctors each year.

The urinary tract is responsible for removing waste and excess water from the body. It consists of the bladder, the kidneys, the ureters, and the urethra.

The kidneys filter the blood and remove waste and surplus water to form urine, which then travels down the ureters and is stored in the bladder until it is ready to be

passed through the urethra (urination).

The opening of the urethra is the end of the penis in males and at the front of the vagina in females. The urinary tract can be divided into the upper urinary tract and the lower urinary tract. The upper urinary tract consists of the kidneys and the ureters, and the lower urinary tract consists of the bladder and the urethra.

Fast facts on urinary tract infections

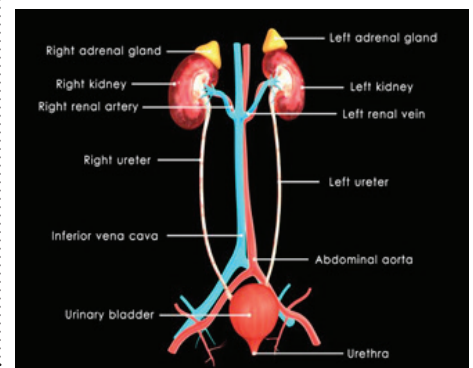

- Common symptoms include a strong, frequent urge to urinate and a painful and burning sensation when urinating

- Uncomplicated urinary tract infections can be cured with 2-3 days of treatment
- Cranberry extracts do not treat UTIs but may help reduce the risk of recurrent UT

What is a urinary tract infection?



The urinary tract is comprised of the bladder, kidneys, ureters, and urethra.

A urinary tract infection (UTI) is an infection of any part of the urinary system. Most infections involve the lower urinary tract. UTIs are given different names depending on where they occur:

- Bladder infection - cystitis
- Urethra infection - urethritis
- Kidney infection - pyelonephritis

The ureters are very rarely the site of infection.

Women are more likely to develop UTIs than men, due to anatomical differences; the urethra is shorter in women than in men, and it is closer to the anus, making it more likely that bacteria are transferred to the bladder.

Over 50 percent of all women will experience at least one UTI during their lifetime, with 20-30 percent experiencing recurrent UTIs.

Pregnant women are not more likely to develop a UTI than other women, but if one does occur, it is more likely to travel up to the kidneys; this is because of anatomical changes during pregnancy that affect the urinary tract.

As a UTI in pregnancy can prove dangerous for both maternal and infant health, most pregnant women are tested for the presence of bacteria in their urine, even if there are no symptoms, and treated with antibiotics to prevent spread.

Most UTIs are not serious, but some can lead to serious problems, particularly with upper urinary tract infections. Recurrent or long-lasting kidney infections (chronic) can cause permanent damage, and some sudden kidney infections (acute) can be life-threatening, particularly if septicemia (bacteria entering the bloodstream) occurs.

They can also increase the risk of women delivering low birth weight or premature infants.

Causes of urinary tract infections

The vast majority of UTI cases are caused by the bacterium *Escherichia coli* (*E. coli*), usually found in the digestive system. *Chlamydia* and *Mycoplasma* bacteria can infect the urethra but not the bladder.

People of any age and sex can develop a UTI; however, some people are more at risk than others. The following factors can increase the likelihood of developing a UTI:

- Sexual intercourse (especially if more frequent, intense, and with multiple or new partners)
- Diabetes
- Poor personal hygiene
- Problems emptying the bladder completely
- Having a urinary catheter
- Bowel incontinence

- Blocked flow of urine
- Kidney stones
- Some forms of contraception
- Pregnancy
- Menopause
- Procedures involving the urinary tract
- Suppressed immune system
- Immobility for a long period
- Use of spermicides and tampons
- Heavy use of antibiotics (which can disrupt the natural flora of the bowel and urinary tract)

Symptoms of urinary tract infections



Abdominal pains are a common symptom of urinary tract infections.

The symptoms of a urinary tract infection can depend on age, gender, the presence of a catheter, and what part of the urinary tract has been infected.

Common symptoms of urinary tract infection include:

- Strong and frequent urge to urinate
 - Cloudy, bloody, or strong smelling urine
 - Pain or burning sensation when urinating
 - Nausea and vomiting
 - Muscle aches and abdominal pains
- People with catheters may only experience fever as a symptom, making diagnosis more difficult.

Acute pyelonephritis

Acute pyelonephritis is a sudden and severe kidney infection. If an individual develops this condition they could also experience upper back and side pain, high fever, shaking, chills, fatigue, and mental changes. It is considered an emergency and should be evaluated by a doctor immediately if suspected.

Cystitis

If a person has a bladder infection, they could also experience low fever, and pressure and cramping in the abdomen and lower back.

Tests and diagnosis

Diagnosis will usually be made after asking about the symptoms and testing a urine sample to assess the presence of white blood cells, red blood cells, and bacteria. A method of collecting urine called "clean catch" is used, which is where a person washes their genital area before collecting a urine sample mid-flow. This helps to prevent bacteria from around the genital area getting caught in the sample.

If a person has recurrent UTIs, a doctor may request further diagnostic testing to determine if anatomical issues or functional issues are to blame. Such tests may include:

- Diagnostic imaging - assessing the urinary tract using ultrasound, CT and MRI scanning, radiation tracking, or X-rays
- Urodynamics - a procedure that determines how well the urinary tract is storing and releasing urine
- Cystoscopy - looking inside the bladder and urethra with a camera lens inserted via the urethra through a long thin tube

Treatment of urinary tract infections



Drinking plenty of water helps flush out urinary tract infections and lowers the risk of future infection.

As urinary tract infections are normally caused by bacteria, they are most commonly treated with antibiotics or antimicrobials. The type of medication and length of treatment will depend on the patient's symptoms and history.

The full course of treatment should always be completed for UTIs to make sure that the infection is fully clear, and to reduce the risk of antibiotic resistance. UTI symptoms can disappear before the infection has completely gone.

- Drinking lots of fluids and frequently urinating

ing are always recommended for people who have UTIs as this helps to flush out the bacteria. A variety of pain relief medications may be prescribed to alleviate pain. Applying a heating pad to the back or abdomen can also help.

An uncomplicated UTI is one that occurs in an otherwise healthy person with a normal clear urinary tract. These can usually be cured with 2-3 days of treatment.

A complicated UTI is one that occurs in a person who is weakened by another condition, such as pregnancy or heart transplant. Complicated UTIs tend to require longer periods of antibiotics, usually between 7-14 days.

To cure a UTI that is caused by problems within the urinary system, the underlying issue needs to be found and corrected. If left untreated, these infections can lead to kidney damage.

If the patient is seriously ill, they may need to be admitted to a hospital to ensure that they take in sufficient fluids and receive the right medication. Patients may also need to go to the hospital if they:

- Are pregnant and are otherwise ill

- Are elderly
- Have cancer, diabetes, multiple sclerosis, spinal cord injury, or other medical problems
- Have kidney stones or other changes in the anatomy of their urinary tract
- Have recently undergone urinary tract surgery

Recurrent infections in women

Women who have recurrent bladder infections may be advised to:

- Take a single dose of an antibiotic after sexual contact
- Take a single, daily dose of an antibiotic for at least 6 months
- Take a short course - 2-3 days - of an antibiotic if symptoms reappear
- Have vaginal estrogen therapy if postmenopausal

Prevention

There are several measures that can be taken to reduce the risk of developing a UTI:

- Drink lots of water and urinate frequently
- Avoid fluids such as alcohol and caffeine that

can irritate the bladder

- Urinate shortly after sex
- Wipe from front to back after urinating and bowel movement
- Keep the genital area clean
- Showers are preferred to baths and avoid using oils
- Sanitary pads or menstrual cups are preferred to tampons
- Avoid using a diaphragm or spermicide for birth control
- Avoid using any perfumed products in the genital area
- Wear cotton underwear and loose-fitting clothing to keep the area around the urethra dry

Individuals are advised to contact a doctor if they develop the symptoms of a UTI, especially if they have developed the symptoms of a potential kidney infection (acute pyelonephrit



THE MYSTERY OF CANCER OF THE CERVIX IN WOMEN~~~ the sexually transmitted Cancer.

Another good news about cancer of the cervix is that unlike other cancers, it can be prevented by vaccination.

Cancer of the cervix is a cancer in women that affects the lower part of the womb, called cervix. It is the 4th most common cause of cancer deaths in women worldwide with a global burden of over 500,000 cases per year. Sad to hear still, it's far much more common in low income countries, considered a cancer of the poor and in Uganda it's No.1 cause of cancer deaths in women.

It's caused by a virus called Human Papilloma Virus (HPV), spread mainly through unprotected sexual intercourse. What's puzzling is that when a woman contracts the virus, the disease develops very slowly, it takes between 10 to 30 years to develop symptoms and signs of the cancer. Meaning she'll feel completely healthy unaware that she's developing a cancer all these decades; such that when symptoms finally appear, it may be too late to treat and she may lose her womb as a result. By this time she's around 35 to 45 years old if she first had sexual intercourse at the age of around 15 years.

Therefore, if a woman asks me, "how do I know I am already developing cancer of my cervix???"

I tell her "It's very simple!!!! Go to the nearest Health facility so that they screen you for cancer of the cervix". The health workers normally check women between the age of 20 to 60 years to detect whether they are developing the disease or not. Those with early disease can also be detected. Fortunately these can be treated and cured completely. It only takes 3 minutes to get you checked up and this is repeated every 3 years until you are 60 years old.

Another good news about cancer of the cervix is that unlike other cancers, it can be prevented by vaccination. However, only young girls between 9 to 12 years old and any woman below 25 years old who is truly sure that she has NEVER had sexual intercourse can be vaccinated. Know Your World Super Tournament

This first took place in Uruguay from 13th July to 30th July 1930. Uruguay was selected

to be the host nation because she would be celebrating the Centenary of her first constitution.

Uruguay national football team had successfully retained their football title at the 1928 summer

Olympics. All matches were played in the Uruguayan Capital, Montevideo. The majority at the

Estadio Centenario which was built for the tournament.

Thirteen teams [7 from South America, 4 from Europe and 2 from North America] entered the

Tournament.

The first matches were played simulta-

neously. [France 4-1 Mexico] and [USA 3-0 Belgium]

Argentina, Uruguay, USA and Yugoslavia each won their respective groups to qualify for semi

Finals.

In the final, host and Pre-tournament favourites Uruguay defeated Argentina 4-2 in front of

68,346 people and became the first nation to win the WORLD CUP.

NB. This was the only World Cup tournament without qualification matches.

Every country affiliated with FIFA was invited to compete and given a deadline of 28th February

1930 to accept.

Lautien Laurent became the first world cup goalscorer. He was from France.
